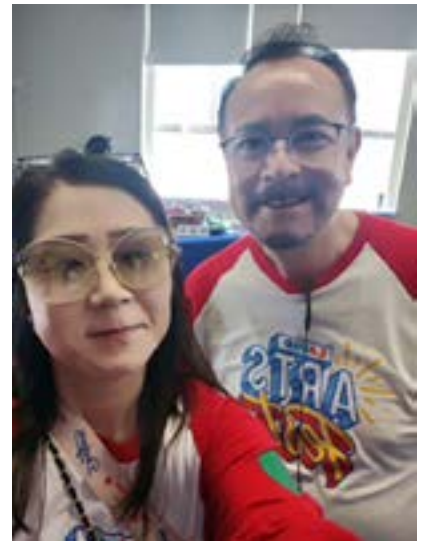

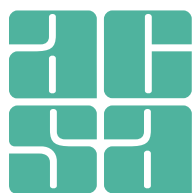

# Issues Brief

**Goal:** Inform legislators of key issues impacting schools in their communities, along with solutions that would provide meaningful change. It is important for legislators to have local context to deepen their understanding of how they can best support their school communities. Please share local examples to illustrate the issues. Student-centered stories resonate most with elected officials.

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## Robust and stable school funding

### Fully Fund Prop. 98 and LCFF

As the state grapples with its budgetary challenges, stability in our public education system must be maintained for students and families. Rising costs and inflation, combined with declining enrollment, expiring one-time funds, and the ending of state-enacted attendance relief, put school district fiscal stability at serious risk. Protecting Proposition 98 and fully funding the Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is critical to building on the progress that has been made in recent years.

**Questions to consider:** What student offerings and initiatives have you successfully implemented in recent years that were supported by state investments? What current and anticipated budgetary challenges are you experiencing or expecting? What impact will these fiscal challenges have on your student academic and support programs?

**Request:** ACSA urges the Legislature to prioritize education funding, including supporting a Cost-Of-Living-Adjustment (COLA) for the LCFF and protecting schools from cuts.

### Emergency School Closures

Emergencies like fires, floods, and mudslides impact entire communities and often wipe out power, water, and destroy school and community infrastructure. Schools move as quickly as possible to return to educating students when disaster strikes. Predicating funding on pivoting to remote learning five days into an emergency is not feasible and will jeopardize schools' fiscal stability during times of need.

**Questions to consider:** Has your school experienced an emergency closure and if so, what was that experience like for the school community? Were there challenges that would have prevented a shift to remote learning within five days of emergency closure?

**Request:** ACSA urges the Legislature to reject the governor's proposal that mandates that schools offer remote learning during emergencies lasting more than five days.

### Reinstate Transitional Kindergarten Commitment

Since the start of universal Transitional Kindergarten (TK) implementation, there has been a commitment to schools that reduced class size ratios would be supported with state funding. TK classrooms are currently required to be staffed on a 1:12 staff-to-student ratio and in 2025-26, the state will require schools to meet a 1:10 ratio. Schools received funding to support the shift to a 1:12 ratio. However, last year the commitment to fund the forthcoming 1:10 ratio was rescinded.

**Questions to consider:** What successes and challenges are you having with TK implementation? How will lowered staffing ratios without additional funding make implementation difficult?

**Request:** ACSA urges the Legislature to reinstate the commitment to fund lower staffing ratios. In the event the state cannot fund the lower ratio, we request a delay in the staffing ratio requirement until funding can be provided.



# HEALTHCARE

## FAQS *How Many Prescription Drugs Do You Take?*

According to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC), in a 30-day period, 7 out of 10 adults aged 40 to 79 took one prescription drug, while 2 out of 5 took five prescription drugs during the same period. In the 40-79 age group, antidepressants, lipid lowering drugs, and angiotensin converting enzyme (ACE) inhibitors (for lowering blood pressure) were most prevalent, while lipid-lowering drugs, antidiabetic agents, and beta blockers were most common for the 60-79 age group.

### What are the 10 most prescribed drugs?

Studies will show differing results depending on the year studied and sampling gathered. A National Institute of Health (NIH) sponsored study of prescription data for 2020-2021 shows lipid-lowering drugs, **rosuvastatin** and **atorvastatin** at the top of the list, followed by **pantoprazole** and **esomeprazole**, both proton pump inhibitors to treat gastrointestinal conditions. Fifth and tenth on the list, respectively, include **perindopril** and **amlodipine** to lower blood pressure. Sixth and eighth were **escitalopram**, used to treat depression, and **sertraline** to treat psychiatric disorders such as obsessive-compulsive, panic, post-traumatic stress, and other disorders. The top 10 also included diabetes medication, **metformin** for diabetes 2, and **cefalexin**, for treating bacterial infections such as pneumonia, urinary infections, and skin infections.

### Are there other medications among the most prescribed that were not included on the list provided?

Yes, several other reports have published top 10 lists. Medical News Today's list included many of the same drugs with **levothyroxine** for hypothyroidism, in 2nd place, **hydrocodone with acetaminophen** for treating pain in 9th place and **albuterol** for asthma in 10th place. CliniCal.com, with its extensive database and a top 10 list for 2018-2019, includes gabapentin, an anticonvulsant, in 10th place.

### In addition to taking multiple prescribed medications, I also take supplements. Which are the most common supplements people take?

Data from National Health Statistics show that about 60% of adults 20 years and older have used dietary supplements over the last 30 days. Multivitamin/mineral supplements are the most used, followed by Vitamin D and Omega-3 fatty acids. Older adults tend to use more supplements than younger adults. Just a reminder that taking multiple prescribed drugs and multiple supplements can potentially result in interaction between drug and supplement, so it's important to review all your drugs and supplements with your primary care doctor.

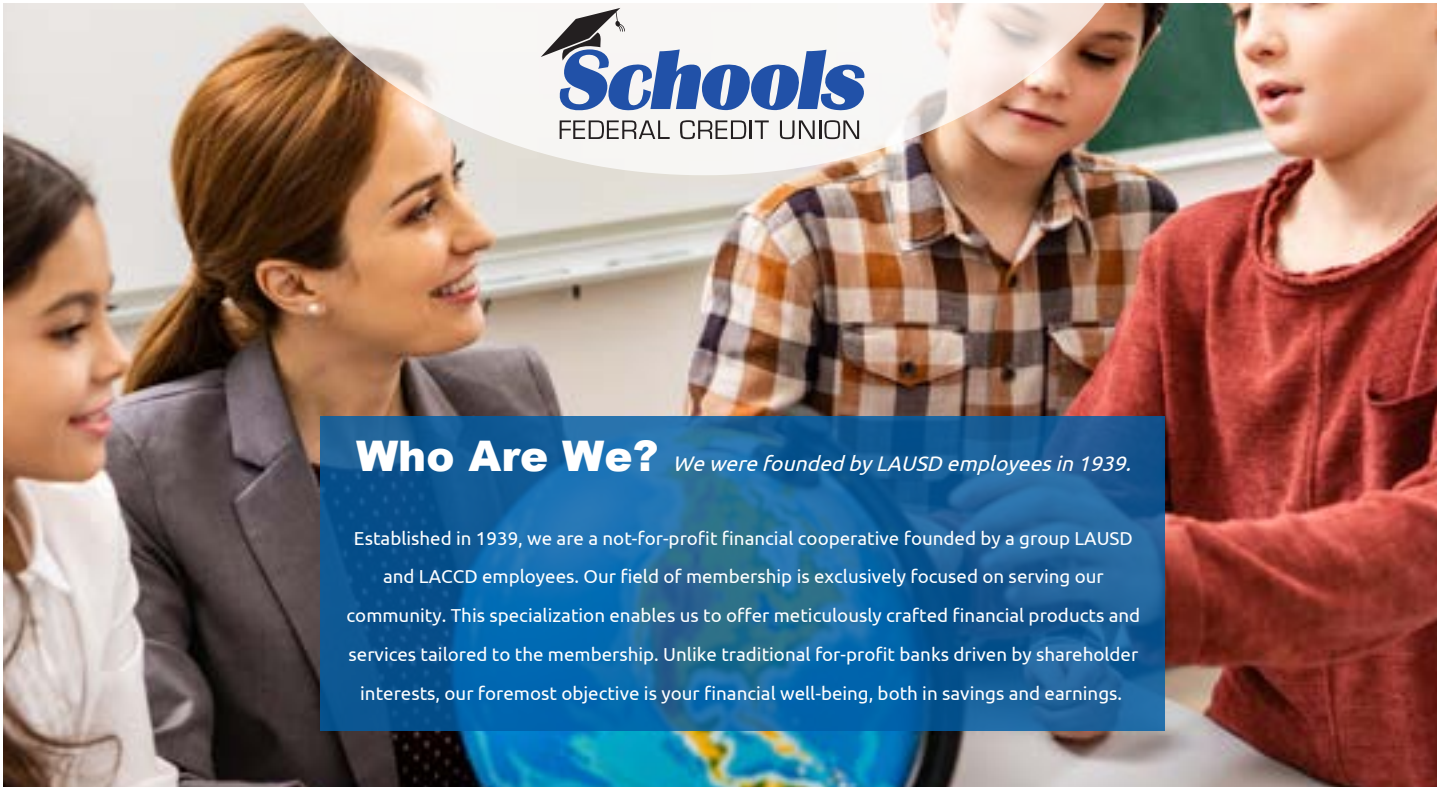
**FINAL EVALUATION** deadlines are just around the corner. AALA would like to remind members that supervise certificated employees of contractual deadlines. If you missed one and the employee evaluated disagrees with the final evaluation, all your hard work will be tossed out when they grieve.

# REPORT, REPORT, REPORT!

**Please heed reporting mandates.** If you suspect or are made aware of suspected child abuse, **REPORT IT.** If you believe someone else reported it, **follow up on the same day!** And, **create an iSTAR report** or confirm that an iSTAR report was created that same day. It is always best practice to apprise your Region Director and Operations Coordinator of the situation and update the iSTAR as needed.

Remember that your standard is "reasonable suspicion" and you can CLARIFY before you report. *Clarification is a process of asking the victim(s), alleged perpetrator(s) and other individuals, clarifying questions in order to determine reasonable suspicion of the allegation.* Please, READ the definition of "reasonable suspicion" on page 5 of BUL-1347.5. **If you have reasonable suspicion make the call. If the reporting agency tells you there is nothing there, ask for the person's name, badge number, and ask if you can handle it administratively. You may begin an investigation ONLY IF you are told to handle it administratively.**

**At this time, it appears the District is taking the stance that if the allegation is made against a district employee, you MUST report. Suspend reasonable suspicion and make the call!**
