CAUSA represents over 6,000 front-line managers (certificated and classified) from eight CA school districts with administrative unions. CAUSA has existed for close to three decades "Empowering Educational Leaders to Improve Working

Conditions." Ultimately, improved working conditions leads to the betterment of student achievement.

I urge members to be active participants in this process as it is critical to establish a common vision, understanding, language, and expectations as we move forward together.



HEALTHCARE FAQS Open Enrollment is Here!

Open Enrollment is upon us, opening today, **October 28** and closing on **November 19th**! For **active employees**, all communication is being sent to your LAUSD email address. Employees must **enroll** to access Open Enrollment Portal.

- 1. Visit the <u>open enrollment portal</u>. You must be on the LAUSD network to access the portal. If you must access the portal outside the LAUSD Network, you must connect through VPN, <u>click here for VPN instructions</u>.
- 2. To login into the open enrollment portal, use your **single sign-on**.
- 3. Make your selections and confirm. Benefit plans available to you are based on your eligibility and will be reflected in the portal. If you recently contacted Benefits Administration for a benefit change effective 1/1/2025 (i.e. upcoming retirement), then using the open enrollment portal may override your changes.

If you are an active employee, you can see your current elections by logging into **Employee Self-Service (ESS)**.

Dependent Cancellation form

For **retirees**, no action is required if you have no plan changes. Your current medical, dental, and vision plans will carry over to the 2025 plan year. If you wish to change your plans for 2025, you have two options:

- 1. Call Benefits Administration at (213) 241-4262. District staff can take your plan changes over the phone Monday through Friday from 8:00 am 5:00 pm PST (excluding holidays).
- Submit <u>2025 Retiree Benefits Change Form</u>. Complete the Retiree Benefits Change Form and return it to Benefits Administration via mail, email, or fax. The form must be received by November 19 @ 11:59 pm PST.

Background

In 1994, Rodney Wilson, a Missouri high school teacher, believed a month should be dedicated to the celebration and teaching of gay and lesbian history, and gathered other teachers and community leaders. They selected October because public schools are in session and existing traditions, such as Coming Out Day (October 11), occur that month.

Gay and Lesbian History Month was endorsed by GLAAD, the Human Rights Campaign, the National Gay and Lesbian Task Force, the National Education Association and other national organizations. In 2006 Equality Forum assumed responsibility for providing content, promotion and resources for LGBT History Month.

The LGBT community is the only community worldwide that is not taught its history at home, in public schools or in religious institutions. LGBT History Month provides role models, builds community and makes the civil rights statement about our extraordinary national and international contributions.
