Voting for the office of AALA President and executive board positions closed on Tuesday, March 2, 2021. For AALA President, none of the five candidates received the required 50% + one of those voting to be declared the winner. With 1,217 active members in good standing voting for president, the top vote getters are **Nery X. Paiz** (29.9%) and **Kevin Kilpatrick** (20.6%). A runoff vote between Paiz and Kilpatrick begins on Monday, March 8, 2021, through March 17, 2021.

There is also a runoff for School Support Administrators, Director, between **Dr. Rafael Gaeta** and **Angela Sandoval**. AALA congratulates all of the candidates and encourages every eligible member to vote.

AALA RUNOFF ELECTION – BALLOT TROUBLESHOOTING TIPS

If you do not get a ballot, check for the following:

- 1. Emails going directly into your **"junk," "bulk," or "Spam**" inboxes: To check for your ballot, do a search using these descriptors "runoff," <u>aalaoffice@aala.us</u>, or "surveymonkey."
- Are you an "active" dues-paying AALA member? To check your member status, call 213.484.2226. We will check if you are a member. To become a member and receive a ballot, click <u>HERE</u>.
- 3. Did you previously **"opt out"** or unsubscribe from receiving SurveyMonkey emails? To check, go to <u>www.surveymonkey.com</u> and scroll to bottom of page to "Policies," then across to "Email opt-in." To successfully opt back in, you must confirm that you opted out and then receive a "Success" email. Once you opt back in, email <u>gpivaral@aala.us</u> to let us know you opted back in. We can then have a ballot sent to you.

HEALTHCARE FAQs - COMMON REACTIONS TO COVID-19 VACCINE

Now it is your turn! If you haven't been paying attention to the typical reactions to the COVID—19 vaccinations, the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) says:

Common Side Effect:

- Pain and/or swelling, or both, on the arm where you got the shot.
- Fever, chills, tiredness, headache (one, some, or all) throughout the rest of your body.

HEALTHCARE FAQs (Cont.)



If you have pain or discomfort after getting vaccinated, talk to your doctor about taking over-the-counter medicines, such as ibuprofen, aspirin, antihistamines, or acetaminophen. Take these medications to relieve side effects if you have no other medical reasons that prevent you from taking these medications normally. It is not recommended you take these medicines **before** vaccination for the purpose of trying to prevent side effects, because it is not known how these medications may impact how well the vaccine works.

Contact your doctor or healthcare provider:

- If the redness or tenderness where you got the shot increases after 24 hours.
- If your side effects are worrying you or do not seem to be going away after a few days.

If you get a COVID-19 vaccine and you think you might be having a severe allergic reaction after leaving the vaccination site, seek immediate medical care by calling 911. Learn more about <u>COVID-19</u> vaccines and rare severe allergic reactions.

REMEMBER: You cannot get COVID-19 from the vaccine. Since it takes from seven to 14 days for the vaccine to build up immunity, it's possible to get infected with the virus during this time. Yet unknown is whether someone vaccinated can get an asymptomatic COVID-19 infection and spread the virus. And then there are the rapidly transmitting variants against which research is showing current vaccines to be less effective. Until more answers are forthcoming, even after being vaccinated you should continue to take the protective measures of masking, keeping socially distant from others, and washing hands regularly.

GRANT HIGH SCHOOL WINS LAUSD ACADEMIC DECATHLON

CONGRATULATIONS to Grant High School for capturing the LAUSD Academic Decathlon title. The team, coached by **David Sanchez** and **Brennan Azizi**, scored 48,180 points out of a possible 60,000. Winning second place honors was Van Nuys High School, guided by **Jono Mitchell**, with 40,159 points. Marshall High School, coached by **Daniel Badiak** and **Mike Jones**, was third in the competition with a score of 40,317. **Yadira Castillo**, Grant High School, was the top-scoring student in the competition with a score of 8,861 out of 10,000. Yadira was also one \of the two Larry McCormick Memorial Award

recipients, sponsored by AALA, for receiving a top score on the literature exam. The other McCormick recipient was **Nancy Trinh**, Lincoln High School.

Along with Grant, Van Nuys, and Marshall—Westchester Enriched Sciences Magnet (**Patricia Prokopidis**, coach); Bell High School (**Heather Wilson** and **Matthew Moreno**, coaches); Sherman Oaks Center for Enriched Studies (**Suzanna Gordon**, coach); Verdugo Hills High School (**Evae Silva**, coach); and North Hollywood High School (**Raul Barragan**, coach) will advance to the California Academic Decathlon, which will be a virtual competition March 3-20, 2021.

The Dr. Robert Peterson Most Improved Team Award was presented to Sherman Oaks Center for Enriched Studies (**Susanna Gordon**, coach). Reseda Charter High School (**Scott Mercer**, coach) received the Al Perez Scholarship that is awarded annually by the United States Academic Decathlon in honor of the LAUSD graduate and educator for whom a District special education school is named and who served on the USAD Board for thirty years.

Mike Gross, coach, Northridge Academy High School, was named Coach of the Year. **Nidia Castro**, principal, Northridge Academy High School, and **Robert Clarke**, principal, Lake Balboa College Prep, were named Administrators of the Year for their strong support of the Decathlon program at their schools.

Congratulations are also extended to all of the schools' administrative staffs for the outstanding performances of their teams. The Academic Decathlon is presented by Beyond the Bell, Alfaro Cortés, Senior Executive Director, and coordinated by Luis Mora, Academic Enrichment Programs Administrator.
