## HEALTHCARE FAQs— *COVID-19 YELLOW TIER GUIDE FOR LOS ANGELES COUNTY*

Due to low COVID-19 infection rates, Los Angeles County has moved into the yellow tier, which is the least restrictive. The surrounding counties of San Bernardino, Orange, Ventura, and Riverside currently remain in orange tier. On May 10, 2021, these counties met the requirements for a less restrictive tier; however, they must maintain case rate and test positivity thresholds for two consecutive weeks before moving into the less restrictive yellow tier.

The following are guidelines for the yellow tier in Los Angeles County. Note that modifications may refer to 1) wearing masks and maintaining social distancing; 2) different thresholds when all attendees are vaccinated and show negative test results; or 3) different thresholds, depending on group size.

### **YELLOW TIER RULES**

- Schools: Have been permitted to reopen for in-person instruction after five days out of the purple tier
- Hair salons and barbershops: Open indoors with modifications
- Nail salons: Open indoors with modifications
- Personal care services (body waxing, facials, tattoos, microblading, etc.): May open indoors with modifications
- Gyms: Open indoors at 50% capacity, and includes spas, saunas, steam rooms, and indoor pools
- Places of worship: Open indoors at 50% capacity
- Retail: Open indoors with modifications
- Malls: Open indoors with limited food court capacity
- Restaurants: Open indoors at 50% capacity
- Bars: Open indoors at 25% capacity
- Wineries, breweries, and distilleries: Open indoors at 50% capacity or 200 people, whichever is fewer
- Hotels: Open with modifications, plus their indoor pools can open, spas can open, and fitness centers can open at 50% capacity
- Movie theaters: Open indoors at 50% capacity
- Museums, zoos, and aquariums: Open indoors with modifications
- Family entertainment centers: Open indoors at 50% capacity including arcades, ice skating, roller skating, and indoor playgrounds
- Theme parks: Can reopen at 35% capacity
- Professional sports: Outdoor stadiums can have audiences up to 67% capacity
- Live performances: Outdoor only at 67% capacity

## FAKE CALLS FROM APPLE AND AMAZON: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Have you received a call telling you there is a problem with your Amazon account? Scammers are calling people and using the names of two companies everyone knows, Apple and Amazon, to rip people off. Below is an article from the Federal Trade commission about what you should do before you become the victim of a scam.

In one version of the scam, you get a call and a recorded message saying it's from Amazon. The message says there's something wrong with your account. It could be a suspicious purchase, a lost package, or an order they can't fulfill. In another twist on the scam, you get a recorded message that says there's been suspicious activity in your Apple iCloud account. In fact, they say your account may have been breached.

In both scenarios, the scammers say you can conveniently press 1 to speak with someone or they give you a phone number to call. Don't do either. It's a scam. They're trying to steal your personal information, like your account password or your credit card number.

If you get an unexpected call or message about a problem with any of your accounts, hang up.

- Do **not** press 1 to speak with customer support
- Do **not** call a phone number they gave you
- Do **not** give out your personal information

If you think there may actually be a problem with one of your accounts, contact the company using a phone number or website you know is real.
