WE JUST ROLL LIKE THIS!

WOW! District high schools represent! Looking at this week's accolades one must ask, why don't all district employees that live within district boundaries enroll their children in district schools? AALA members leading these schools exemplify instructional leadership resulting in student excellence.

The week started off with **Principal Susan Parker's** <u>LAUSD Academic Decathlon</u> repeat winning Sherman Oaks Center for Enriched Studies(SOCES) Academic Decathlon team feted by the <u>LA Daily News</u> as they flew off to the Academic Decathlon nationals in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. This is SOCES' 2nd trip in a row to the nationals! Adding another feather to its cap, SOCES received a #10 ranking among LAUSD high schools, #106 out of 2,616 California high schools, and #783 out of close to 17,655 ranked schools in <u>US News & World Report's 2024</u> <u>Best High Schools Rankings</u>. Way to go Principal Parker and Assistant Principals William Crockett, Davina Cunningham, Dana Neill, Cheryl Sanders, and Floyd Weldon!

US News & World Report uses college readiness, state assessment proficiency, state assessment performance, under-served student performance, college curriculum breadth as well as graduation rate to rank schools. Data collected from close to 25,000 public schools across the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Of these, 17,655 schools received a ranking and 130 out of 183 district high schools are on the list.

Among California's top ranked school are The Science Academy STEM Magnet ranked #12 nationally, #3 in the state, #2 among LA metro, and #1 among LAUSD schools. Led by **Principal Carlos Lauchu** and **Assistant Principal Joshua Rosenthal**, The Science Academy STEM Magnet tied for 1st, yes 1st nationally on the college readiness index and graduation rate ranks! And, adds California Distinguished School to its accolades while graduating its first class in 2022. Yeah, wow!

Led by **Principal Desiree Douglas Montoya** and **Assistant Principal Aimee Ross**, Dr. Richard Vladovic Harbor Teacher Preparation Academy follows close behind ranking #47 nationally, #6 among California schools, #5 among LA Metro and #2 in LAUSD. Harbor Teacher Prep also tied for 1st on graduate rate rank in the state and nationally. Along with the US News goal seal, Harbor Teacher Prep proudly carries coveted titles including California Distinguished School in 2024 along with previous designations as a California Gold Ribbon School and National Blue Ribbon School.

and **founding Principal Dr. Elizabeth Ackerman Hicks** followed the research and imagineered a school that offers, "a highly rigorous college preparatory STEMfocused education in an all-girls environment based on voluntary enrollment that fosters academic excellence, ethical leadership, and intellectual curiosity." Under **Principal Ackerman Hicks** and **Assistant Principal Jason Benoit**'s leadership, GALA ranks #160 nationally, #20 in California, #6 in LA Metro, #3 in LAUSD and is a California Distinguished School. Bear in mind that this all-girl school opened in 2016 and graduated its first class June 2020. That is an amazing feat!

Next we turn to **Principal Sean Teer and Assistant Principals Saul Plasencia and Juan Torres** who lead Downtown Magnets High School, a top-ranked school with a plethora of accolades. Named a 2023 National Blue Ribbon School, a Magnet Schools of America School of Excellence and California Gold Ribbon School, Downtown Magnets High School ranked #272 nationally, #33 in the state, #11 among LA Metro schools and #4 in the district!

We move on to Los Angeles Center for Enriched Studies (LACES) led by **Principal Kimberly Lesure** and Assistant Principals Alexander Brandy, Oliver Rivas, Jacob Rustum. LACES also carries the titles of National Blue Ribbon School and California Distinguished School. It ranks #331 nationally, #43 among California schools, #15 in the Los Angeles Metro area, and #5 in the district. And a bit of district history resides there as the very first LAUSD magnet !

Coming in at #6 in the district is **Principal William Bazadier's** Middle College High School. Supported by **Assistant Principal Courtney Stanton**, **Principal Bazadier** leads a unique school sitting on the Los Angeles Southwest Community College with readily accessible dual enrollment. Middle College High School ranks #25 in the Los Angeles Metro area, #70 in the great state of California and #520 nationally. And imagine, in 1989 opened as district continuation high school!

International Studies Learning Center at Legacy High School lands on #7 in the district, #27 in among Los Angeles Metro area high schools, #80 statewide and #613 nationally. **Principal Marcos Hernandez** and **Assistant Principal Ruben Escobar** lead this California Gold Ribbon and P-21 Exemplar School as well as the Asia Society International Studies Schools Network.

Principal Luis M. Lopez' Francisco Bravo Medical Magnet High School lands at #8 in the district. **Assistant Princpals Jungsug Ghong, Gabriela Guerra-Ramirez**, and **Diana Lee** work alongside **Principal Lopez**. Bravo Medical Magnet is a 2024 California Distinguished School, Magnet Schools of America School of Excellence, National Blue Ribbon School as well as Linked Learning Gold Pathway certified. It ranks #618 nationally, #81 in California, and #28 among LA Metro Area high schools.

At #9 district wide, Orthopaedic Hospital Senior High Medical Magnet. **Principal Gustavo Barrientos** and **Assistant Principal Yvonne Huang** lead this California Distinguished School, Magnet Schools of America School of Merit that checks in at #29 among LA Metro Area schools, #83 in California and #646 nationally.

Rounding out the district top ten, SOCES (see paragraph 2). In ranked order, the following schools are in the top 10% of nationally ranked schools:

Technological advances have transformed medical record keeping from paper-based to electronics-based, making healthcare delivery easier and more accessible. Despite the advantages of digital records, health records are at risk of being hacked. When hacked, your medical information is exposed and/or shut down. Since 2011, more than 10 billion records have been breached by cyberhackers. Of these, one-half of the breaches occurred in the healthcare sector. According to the New York Times, studies show that when a cyberattack occurs, patient care can be severely compromised. For example, surgeries will be canceled, care plans become disrupted, prescribed drugs and drug allergies unavailable, to list just a few possible consequences.

As a potential victim, what can I do to keep my health information and other personal records secure from cyberthreats?



As consumers, we rely on our medical insurers, including the District, to keep our data safe, secure, and private; we can't prevent an attack on entire data systems. However, there are steps we can take to protect our identity on our own systems vis-à-vis passwords, viruses, phishing, and the other ways hackers intrude in your privacy. Here are some steps to help you keep secure:

- ► Change user passwords frequently for your healthcare accounts, credit card accounts, and/or emails associated with your accounts. Make sure you set strong passwords.
- your medical ► Monitor records frequently. Monitoring includes checking your Explanation of Benefits (EOB) statements to ensure their accuracy.
- ➤ Check your healthcare accounts for any changes to your member profile, such as changes in your address or phone number(s).
- ► Place a freeze or fraud alert on your credit file by contacting one of the three national credit reporting

- ► Monitor your credit card accounts/statements to check for any charges that you didn't make.
- ► Be stingy about the personal information you share online. Install anti-virus protection on all your devices, if not preinstalled. You might consider identity protection or fraud protection software. For source information, click on the following links: IdentityTheft.gov (FTC), pcmag.com, Tom's Guide, CNET, or search "fraud protection." Another solution to consider is a VPN, or a "virtual private network." Simplistically, a VPN protects your privacy by encrypting your personal data. The major online browsers offer private or incognito settings that hide your browsing history, cookies, filled forms, and site data. Be cautious about using these. For more information about private (not VPN) browsers, see What is private browsing?
- ► Beware of phishing fraud emails, texts, and phone calls. Phishing scams may look or sound like they come from your insurer. Emails may include a "click here" link for access to your account. These messages are NOT from legitimate sources, and you should NOT -
 - \succ click on any links in questionable email.
 - > reply to the email, text, or call, or reach out to the senders in any way.
 - > supply any information on the website if you have clicked on a link in the email.
 - \succ open any attachments that arrive with email or text.
- ► Make a copy of your medical files so that you have a baseline record and history of your medical conditions and treatment received.

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




