It is never too late to review and revisit the “Every School Safe” [Blue Print for Safety](#). This is especially so given the ever escalating situations happening district wide.

It is also an auspicious time to share it with Summer Session Principals especially if it is their first assignment as principal. For starters, make sure you have [downloaded](#) the LASAR and LAUSD Emergency Alert apps.

The Los Angeles Schools Anonymous Reporting app, or LASAR, aims to increase community-focused public safety in and around our LAUSD schools by allowing students, families and community members to anonymously report non-emergency school safety incidents directly to the Los Angeles School Police Department (LASPD). The LAUSD Emergency Alert app is available to employees allowing the to alert LASPD of an active assailant situation in real-time. The app automatically detects the school location of the user.

Keep the manual handy as it is a go to for important operational topics. It becomes especially useful if an emergency arises as some of the actions an administrator might need to take are provided in a user-friendly manner.

VOICES FROM THE FIELD

Members responded to AALA's call for input on the Workplace Violence Prevention Plan:

"An idea on the acts of violence against administrators. Have administrators that have been assaulted from the past to the next board meeting attend the board meeting. You go up and state that we have unsafe working conditions without school police, and here are the administrators assaulted to date. Have them stand in silence.

Repeat this at every board meeting with administrators assaulted between the prior board meeting and the next and continue until action is taken. Do not give school names or administrators' names. Just have them stand.

This is would powerfully visually, and also restorative for those impacted as they will see they are not alone."

"1) Cell phone Blocking technology is great. We need more push back on school police being assigned even if we are grouped with high schools that way the same officer is readily available within seconds not hours.

2) Also, bringing back random searches. [This should be a] School by school decision. Have the community vote and decide. This would prevent the drugs. Violence. And many other safety issues we have in the hood.

3) Clear guidance in writing from central on how administrators should handle life threatening fights between students or attacks on adults when school police is not on site."

FAQS *Traveling Out of the Country?*

Post-pandemic, summer travel is back in full force. You can be proactive about staying healthy during your trip by learning about your travel destination(s), ensuring your immunizations are up-to-date, and getting any additional vaccinations needed. Vaccinations are important because some diseases not common in the United States still exist in other parts of the world.

Where can I check for travel safety, health risks or any special immunizations needed?

- Check out the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) [Before You Travel](#) advice for general trip preparations such as vaccinations, bringing medications, travel insurance, preparing for emergencies, and more.
- Additional preparation advice can be found on the [Traveler's Checklist](#) provided by the U.S. Department of State. Note the unique traveler profiles.
- CDC's [Travelers' Health](#) offers the latest advisories on immunizations needed for the specific destination(s) you will visit.
- [Travel Health Notices](#) inform travelers about global health risks during disease outbreaks and provide advice on protective actions to take. Currently, global poliovirus is circulating in 30 African, three East Mediterranean countries, and Indonesia, with travel advice to "Practice Enhanced Precautions."

How far in advance should I start checking for immunization needed for travel?

The recommended time is four to six in advance of your departure date. Some vaccines, such as the typhoid vaccine may require taking prior to travel to the affected area. Other vaccines may cause uncomfortable side effects that you don't want to experience during your vacation.

Are travel immunizations covered by my LAUSD health plan?

Immunizations that are part of your recommended immunizations are covered by your plan. Kaiser plan members have access to travel immunizations and vaccines through the Travel Clinic. You simply call the [Travel Clinic](#) with the dates of your travel and the country or countries you are visiting and a nurse will provide information on the immunizations or vaccine prescriptions needed and how to obtain them. If you belong to Anthem Blue Cross or Health Net, travel immunizations may not be covered, but can be obtained through your primary care physician.

What other information is helpful for traveling internationally?

The CDC website also provides advice on food, water and beverage safety while traveling, as well as symptoms when you should see a doctor. Information on food and water safety is available at: <http://wwwnc.cdc.gov/travel/page/infographic-food-water-whats-safer>.

What if I get sick when traveling?

Your District health plans provide for emergency treatment. Check your health plan for the details of your coverage. The U.S. State Department recommends you purchase travel insurance to cover emergency medical care since medical facilities and providers abroad may require cash up front. If treated while traveling internationally and you do not have trip medical care, obtain written documentation about your condition, treatment, and costs to be reimbursed by your plan, if qualified.

How can I keep informed about changes in health advisories and travel safety?

A free service by the State Department called [Smart Traveler Enrollment Program](#) (STEP) informs by emails with updates from the local U.S. embassy or consulate. In addition, if there is an emergency the State Department can contact you with instructions on what to do.

UNION VISITORS ON SCHOOL CAMPUS

Administrators as a reminder, Union Representatives may periodically visit school sites and/or district locations unannounced to meet with their members. The District is required to provide reasonable access to district facilities which may also include contacting employees before or after their work day and during their duty-free break and lunch. However, such access should not interrupt the employee's regular work duties during their assigned hours. Representatives are permitted to enter school campuses and/or district locations and should adhere to the LAUSD Visitor's policy.

Union Representatives are to:

- Provide proper identification, inform the administrator or designee of their presence upon their arrival at a work site, and state their intended purpose.
- Conduct themselves in a respectful manner.
- Not disrupt employees during their assigned work time.
- Inform the main office of their departure and return the visitor's permit before leaving the work location.

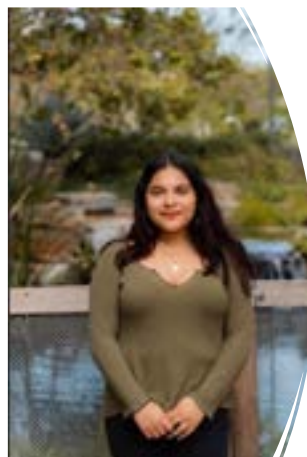

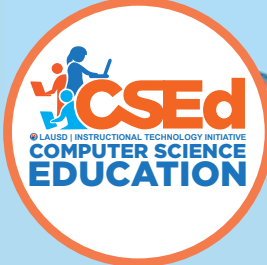
